In November we met at Bennett Galleries where fellow Guild member Marga McBride discussed her latest series, Portrayals. A multimedia exhibition comprised of sculpture, painting, and drawing. Speaking at the gallery Marga described her work as "a series of figurative ceramic personalities that have come to me either while dreaming, or just by 'asking' the clay as I work. Sometimes a painting will come first, then I make a sculpture, and sometimes it's the other way around!"
